# Objectives of the ISO Five-Year Plan

- Improve awareness
- Develop capacity
- Increase national and regional cooperation
- Develop electronic communication and expertise in IT tools
- Increase participation in governance and technical work of ISO

# DEVCO Institutional Changes

- Extension of DEVCO Terms of Reference to include a monitoring function
- Establishment of DEVCO Chairs' Advisory Group (CAG)
- DEVCO Annual meeting format

# DEVCO Chair's Advisory Group

- Consists of 9 members
  - ⇒ 6 from developing countries
  - ⇒ 3 from developed countries
- Term of office 2 years renewable once
- Meets twice a year
- Chaired by DEVCO Chair

# DEVCO Chair's Advisory Group Functions

- To assist DEVCO in monitoring the implementation of the Action Plan for developing countries
- To work with DEVCO Secretariat in preparing agenda for the DEVCO plenary meetings
- To carry out specific tasks defined by ISO DEVCO

# 39<sup>th</sup> DEVCO Plenary Meeting

- To be held 19-20 September 2005
- Discussion topics
  - ⇒ Group 1 : Establishing an effective national quality infrastructure – Focus on LDCs
  - ⇒ Group 2 : Enhancing developing country participation in the standardization process – New initiatives
  - ⇒ Group 3 : Good regulatory practice – International standards for technical regulations

# Involvement in Technical Work

## TWINNING

- A mechanism that improves participation of developing countries
- Need for flexibility
- Engagement of stakeholders in the standardization process

# Acquainting Industry Experts with Technical Work

## TEST DRIVE

- Raising awareness of stakeholders in developing countries
- Providing experts from developing countries with training and education
- Pilot phase of the project
- 3 phases in test drive programme
  - ⇒ Training
  - ⇒ Attendance
  - ⇒ Dissemination

# Assessing Priorities for Standardization

## E-LEARNING

- E-learning module 1
- Training modules
  - ⇒ Assessing priorities for standardization
  - ⇒ Managing participation in international standardization
  - ⇒ Implementing international standards
- Developing countries face many challenges related to accessibility, understanding and in some cases acceptance of electronic communications technology
- E-learning offers viable solutions
- “Learn by-doing” approach
