Directions to DIN

Nearest underground station (U-Bahn): Wittenbergplatz.

Nearest main-line railway station: Hauptbahnhof, approx. 10 minutes by S-Bahn (city-rail) to Zoologischer Garten in direction Westkreuz. From there a 10-minute walk, or by Bus 100 to Bayreuther Straße.

Nearest regional railway station: Zoologischer Garten, approx. 10 minutes walking distance or by Bus 100 to Bayreuther Straße.

From the airport: S9, RE7, RB14 to Zoologischer Garten

Travel within Berlin

Public Transport: Plan your route here. - <https://sbahn.berlin/en/> - (shows alternative routes with travel duration and ticket price), Tickets can be bought from [ticket machines](#) which are usually located on or near the platform. Traveling from the Airport BER to S+U Zoologischer Garten you will need to purchase a Berlin ABC ticket. When traveling from Hauptbahnhof a Berlin AB ticket is sufficient.

Taxis: If you do not see a Taxi near the Entrance of the Airport or Main Railway station you can call a Taxi (+49 30 202020) or an Uber (using the app). Prices may vary.

Train travel within Germany

With your Deutsche Bahn Event Ticket at a fixed price, you can travel sustainably from any German Rail (DB) station to DIN Group events (throughout Germany) and back again, City Ticket included. **In addition to the booked ticket, the invitation or confirmation of participation in the event must be carried and presented when the ticket is inspected.**

From the Reichstag parliament building to Alexanderplatz. From Gendarmenmarkt square to the [Museum Island](#). Berlin is full of surprising things to discover. Here, you can find our selected highlights at a glance.

TIP 1: Reichstag parliament building and the glass dome



The German parliament is not just a place where major policy decisions are taken. This is also where policies are implemented.

The Reichstag's glass dome is a special attraction for visitors to Berlin.

TIP 2: Brandenburg Gate



An absolute must-see sight – and easy to reach. If you are travelling by tube, the Brandenburger Tor station has an elevator to take you directly to the square at Pariser Platz.

TIP 3: Unter den Linden boulevard



Unter den Linden is the grand boulevard connecting Brandenburg Gate with Alexanderplatz.

TIP 4: Kurfürstendamm boulevard



In the nineteenth century, Otto von Bismarck, Germany's "Iron Chancellor", ordered Kurfürstendamm to be constructed as a grand boulevard, transforming what had previously been just a bridle path. Today, Ku'damm, as locals say, symbolizes the Roaring Twenties, war-torn Berlin and the modern fashionable metropolis. Here, you can explore more than a hundred years of history on over 3.5 km.

TIP 5: Berlin Wall Memorial

The Berlin Wall is a thing of the past – but at the Berlin Wall Memorial, the years of the division of Germany come vibrantly alive. Today, the main memorial site of German division is a large open-air exhibition on the former border strip along Bernauer Straße. We recommend beginning your visit at the accessible Visitor Centre close to the Nordbahnhof S-Bahn (city railway).

TIP 6: Museum Island



Keen on culture, history and heritage? Then head for Berlin's famous Museum Island! Here, you'll find no less than five renowned museums:

- Pergamon Museum (currently closed due to construction)
- Bode Museum
- Alte Nationalgalerie (Old National Gallery)
- Altes Museum (Old Museum) and the Neues Museum (New Museum)

In 1999, this ensemble of museums was inscribed as UNESCO World Heritage.

- **TIP 7: Potsdamer Platz**



Potsdamer Platz is the home of the Berlinale, a meeting point for shopping fans, and connects the inner city in the east with the new west of Berlin. This is one of Berlin's most popular sights to visit, and all the U-Bahn (tube) and S-Bahn (city railway) stations here are equipped with elevators and escalators.

- **TIP 8: Charlottenburg Palace**

Today, this is the largest and most magnificent palace in Berlin – a highlight for any Berlin visitor. Charlottenburg Palace recounts the history of the Hohenzollern dynasty which ruled Prussia from the 1600s to the early 1900s. The palace was named after Sophie Charlotte, the first Queen consort in Prussia. Today, it is owned by the Prussian Cultural Heritage Foundation (SPK).

TIP 9: Gendarmenmarkt

Gendarmenmarkt is arguably Berlin's most beautiful square and the site of three impressive buildings: the German Cathedral, the French Cathedral, and the Konzerthaus. The Gendarmenmarkt square is best known for the building trio that frames it: the German and French Cathedrals and the Konzerthaus (concert hall). Together, they form one of the most stunning architectural ensembles in Berlin. The eventful history of the Gendarmenmarkt can be traced back all the way to the 17th century. Each historical phase has left its architectural traces.
